#### When is camp?

We are heading to camp Friday, March 1st at 12pm and will be back on Sunday, March 3rd around 1pm. Camp is open to all 6th to 12th grade students!

#### Where is camp happening?!

We are going to be at Camp Cedar Crest in the San Bernardino Mountains where we have been taking students to camp for years! We absolutely love this place!

## What is the cost of camp?

This year, winter Camp will cost \$170.00 per student which is due by February 17th, 2019.

## Where is pick up/drop off happening?

Your student will need to be at the Freedom Center in Chatsworth, CA on Friday, March 1st at 12pm for registration and will be picked up at the Freedom Center on March 3rd at 1pm!

## What needs to be done to get my student registered?

We need the following from you: -Socal District Winter Camp registration form -Freedom Church medical release form -Payment of \$170.00 which can be in the form of cash or check (Checks to be made out to Freedom Church)

## Are there any scholarship opportunities?

If your family is in need of a scholarship, please contact JJ Orantes at JJ@Freedom.Church letting him know! We are actively working on fundraising opportunities and want to include your student in these opportunities. We want your student to get to camp and do not want finances to be what stops them for experiencing Jesus!

## Who is driving to camp?

Your students will be driving up to camp in top of the line charter buses with licensed, background checked, and certified bus drivers who will be putting the safety of your child first. The buses will be co-ed with adult youth leaders from Freedom sitting throughout the bus with your students.

## My child takes medication daily, can they keep it with them?

If your child takes medication on a regular basis, we will need you to turn this in upon registration at the Freedom Center on Friday, March 1st. Upon arriving at Camp Cedar Crest, it will be turned into the camp nurse. Your student will need to get their medication daily from camp nurse. <u>The only exception to this rule is inhalers.</u> Medication should be properly labeled with the students first and last name, the dosage and when the medication should be taken.
